Registration & Abstract Submission for Conference Participation

1. Description and Scope of Data Processing

Contacting:

To promote the RRR2025 conference, information will be shared on various websites, and contact details from the Greifswald Mire Centre's contact database will be used. The necessary consent for this, in accordance with Art. 6(1) lit. a GDPR, was obtained from the individuals concerned prior to their inclusion in the contact database.

Registration:

To participate in the RRR2025 conference and submit contributions, registration via the service provider Converia GmbH is required. The personal data processed during this process will be stored by Converia GmbH and transmitted to the University of Greifswald.

Certain mandatory fields must be completed during registration. These details must be provided fully and accurately; otherwise, registration will be denied. Before submitting and storing this information, you will be asked to confirm your acknowledgment of this privacy policy and to consent to the processing of your personal data for registration purposes. The following data will be processed as part of the registration process:

- Login credentials (username, password)
- Address details
- Email address
- Information on submitted contributions (e.g., abstract)

The registration data may be added to the Greifswald Mire Centre's contact database if the required consent in accordance with Art. 6(1) lit. a GDPR is given.



Payment Processing:

To facilitate payment processing for event registration, various payment options are offered (e.g. invoice/bank transfer, credit card). Certified payment service providers are used for this purpose, handling the processing and storage of your payment data (e.g. IBAN). Depending on the chosen payment method, users will be redirected to the respective provider's website. Further information on their data protection can be found on the websites of the respective service providers.

The following data is processed for payment transactions:

- Shopping cart data
- Billing details (invoice recipient and address)
- Membership information
- Proof of eligibility (e.g., student ID)
- Selected payment method
- Invoice amount
- Amount paid

Publication of Contributions:

The contributions you submit will be published online on the website www.moorwissen.de, as well as online and in print in the RRR2025 conference programme and the conference proceedings, including the names and affiliations of all co-authors, provided you have given your consent during the submission process.

Please note that information published on the internet can be accessed by anyone. Despite all technical precautions, it cannot be ruled out that such information may be used or shared by unauthorised persons. Furthermore, we would like to point out that withdrawal of consent for print publications is only possible until the printing process begins, as the processing of personal data and contribution content cannot be reversed afterwards.

2. Legal Basis for Data Processing

The legal basis for processing the registration data for the purpose of submitting contributions, publishing the submitted contributions with name citations, and, if applicable, including them in the contact database of the Greifswald Mire Centre, is your consent in accordance with Art. 6(1) lit. a GDPR.

The legal basis for processing the registration data for the purpose of signing up for participation, processing payments, and the associated processing of personal data is based on Art. 6(1) lit. b GDPR (initiation and execution of a contract, here the paid participation in the conference).

3. Purpose of Data Processing

The processing of your personal data is solely for the planning, execution, and follow-up of the "RRR2025" conference.

4. Duration of Storage

All personal data, submitted documents, and created processing or usage results related to the conference will be deleted no later than 6 months after the conference ends. Exceptions include the publication of contributions and the conference programme with the names and institutions of all co-authors on the website www.moorwissen.de (under the responsibility of the University of Greifswald) and the permanent storage of contact data in the contact



database of the Greifswald Mire Centre (GMC) for sending information by the GMC after the conference ends, provided explicit consent was given during registration.

6. Your Rights

In addition, you have the right to receive information upon request and free of charge about your stored personal data, its origin and recipients, the purpose, and the duration of the data processing. Under certain circumstances, you also have the right to the correction, limitation of the processing (e.g. blocking), deletion, and the data portability of your data.

Data Protection Information for Photos, Videos and Audio Recordings

Photos, video and audio recordings are used for reporting on the event on the University of Greifswald's websites, social media profiles, in print products and media releases. Depending on the individual circumstances, you will



be asked to declare your consent for photographs/recordings that depict persons who are not considered public figures, individuals that are accessories in shots of landscapes or other locations, or photographs/recordings that display crowds, processions or similar events and their character.

No disadvantages shall arise if no consent has been given for the photos/recordings or the consent is withdrawn.

1. Legal basis

Photographs/recordings that depict the character of the event (wide shots):

Art. 6(1) Item (e) in conjunction with Art. 6(3) GDPR in connection with § 4(1) DSG MV

The photographer will ask for your consent for any other photos/recordings:

Art. 6(1) Item (a) GDPR

2. Recipient

Individuals from all over the world using the University of Greifswald's online and print media offers

3. Storage Duration

The photographs/recordings that required the obtainment of consent will be deleted immediately as soon as consent is withdrawn. Otherwise, the photographs/recordings will be stored until the purpose is no longer relevant.

If the documents are worthy of archiving, they will be assumed by the University Archive and usually stored indefinitely.

4. Your rights

You are entitled to receive information from the University of Greifswald about any personal data that is stored about you and/or to have incorrect data that is stored about you corrected.

Furthermore, you are entitled to the deletion or limitation of the processing or may oppose the processing.

In addition, if you have declared your consent to individual photographs/recordings, you are entitled to withdraw your consent at any time, whereby the lawfulness of the data processing that occurred on the basis of the consent remains effective until consent is withdrawn.
