



General Terms and Conditions of the REDOG Association for Events

These General Terms and Conditions (GTC) apply in addition to the legal relationship between the association REDOG (as organizer) and the event visitors (as participants). Individual agreements take precedence.

If no other agreements are made for participants and exhibitors, these GTC also apply to them.

Conclusion of contract

Participation in the events is only possible against advance payment of the invoice. The booking confirmation sent to the customer is considered as the conclusion of the contract between REDOG and the customer.

Payment modalities

The total price of the order is due for payment within 14 days.
Only a payment in advance entitles to participate in the events

Program changes

We reserve the right to make changes to the announced programs and/or to change speakers. This also applies to any cancellations due to official restrictions as a result of pandemic measures. Claims for damages and/or withdrawal from the contract as a result of program changes are expressly excluded. If a complete event does not take place, the participation fee will be refunded. Further claims are expressly excluded.

Data protection and personal rights

When collecting, processing and using personal data, REDOG as the organizer as well as the partners commissioned by it for data management respect the provisions of Swiss data protection legislation. Under no circumstances will personal data be sold to third parties or marketed in any other way.

Liability

REDOG as the organizer is only liable for deliberately caused financial loss, personal injury and property damage. Any further liability is excluded exclusively.

Applicable law/court of jurisdiction

Swiss substantive law is exclusively applicable to the entire contractual relationship between the organizer and the participants. The exclusive place of jurisdiction for all disputes arising from or in connection with these GTC and other contractual claims between the parties is Bern.

In the event of any ambiguity, the German text shall prevail.
